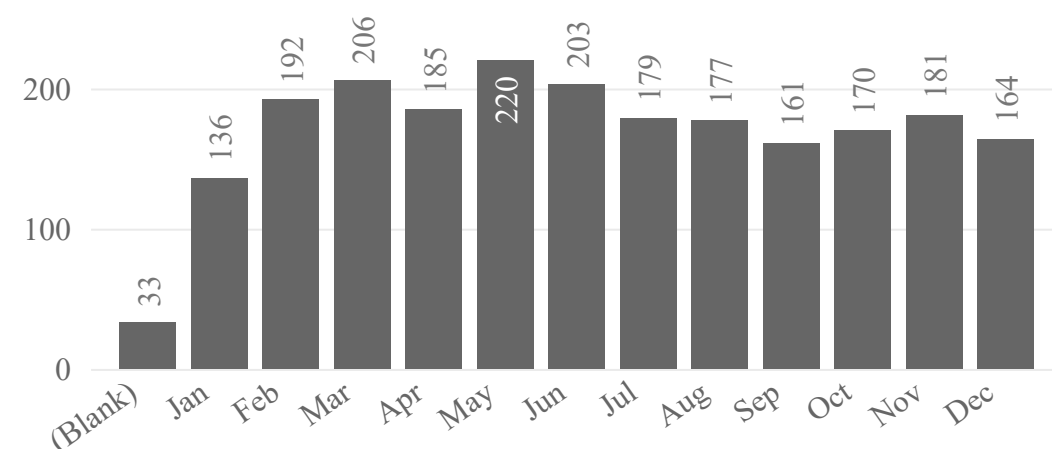

Retaliation Prevention Mediation - One incident attempted or resulted in serious violence prior to Safe Streets mediating but further violence was prevented
