 - Deputy Director of Data Analytics walked the group through the above dashboards with specific emphasis on the Chicago and Atlanta dashboards (see handouts below)
 - Questions about whether not examples of dashboards were available that incorporated all information that the public accountability dashboard will cover such as community/neighborhoods data as opposed to the versions shared that only show law enforcement
 - Dir. Jackson confirmed that this is where input from the principal members will be required.
 - Suggestion that the dashboard focus on violent crimes (formally part 1 category) and have a breakout for IPV data
 - Concerns about including sensitive information specifically as it relates to juveniles
 - to maintain privacy, look at examples such as the Youth Data Hub

- Discussion about including types of data (ex. Arrest or stop data), juvenile aggregated data without including identifying information
- All agree the dashboard should include both qualitative and quantitative data
- Questions to consider as we move forward:
 - What will be the long term outcomes for someone who has had interaction with the criminal justice system?
 - Should the CJCC consider two separate dashboards? (one for internal use and one for public viewing) as some information is not for public use
- Principal members should follow up with CJCC Manager with the name of their data representative for workgroup participation

4. Workgroups Finalized– Ariel Liddell

a. Introductory Meeting-**Week of June 20th**

- 5 person minimum for each workgroup per the bylaws
- Received a total of 251 interest forms from the community between May 10th-27th
- The bylaws do not set a maximum number of workgroup participants
 - CJCC Manager recommends a modification to the bylaws and set a maximum of 15 members for each workgroup
 - Principal members believe 15 is still too large and unanimously voted for an 11-person maximum
- Principal members will provide the CJCC manager the names for the policy representative from their agencies
 - Policy representatives will have 48hrs to review the excel document of potential workgroups and provide feedback

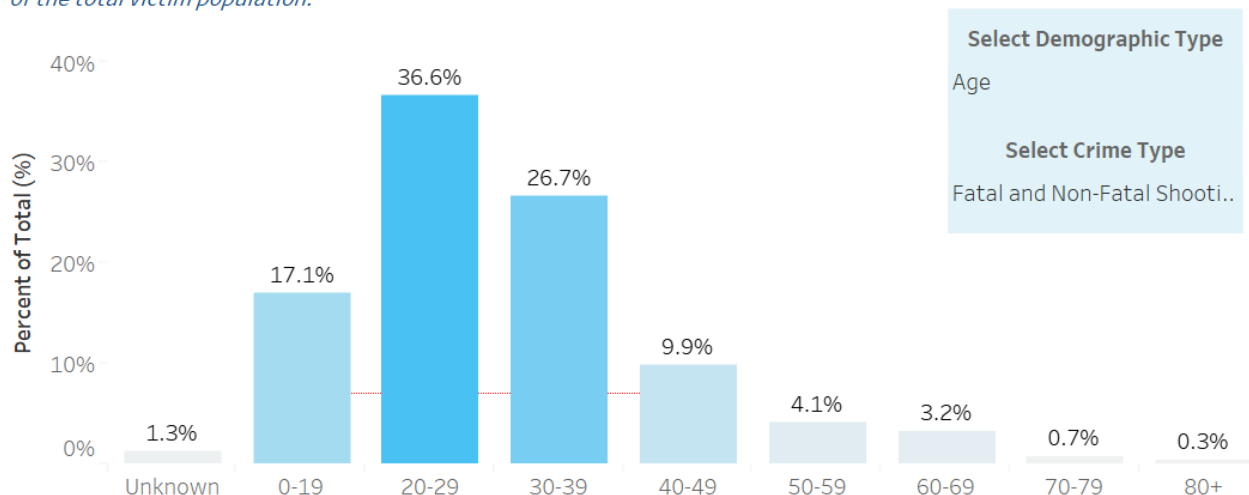

Demographics of Fatal and Non-Fatal Shooting Victims in All Community Areas

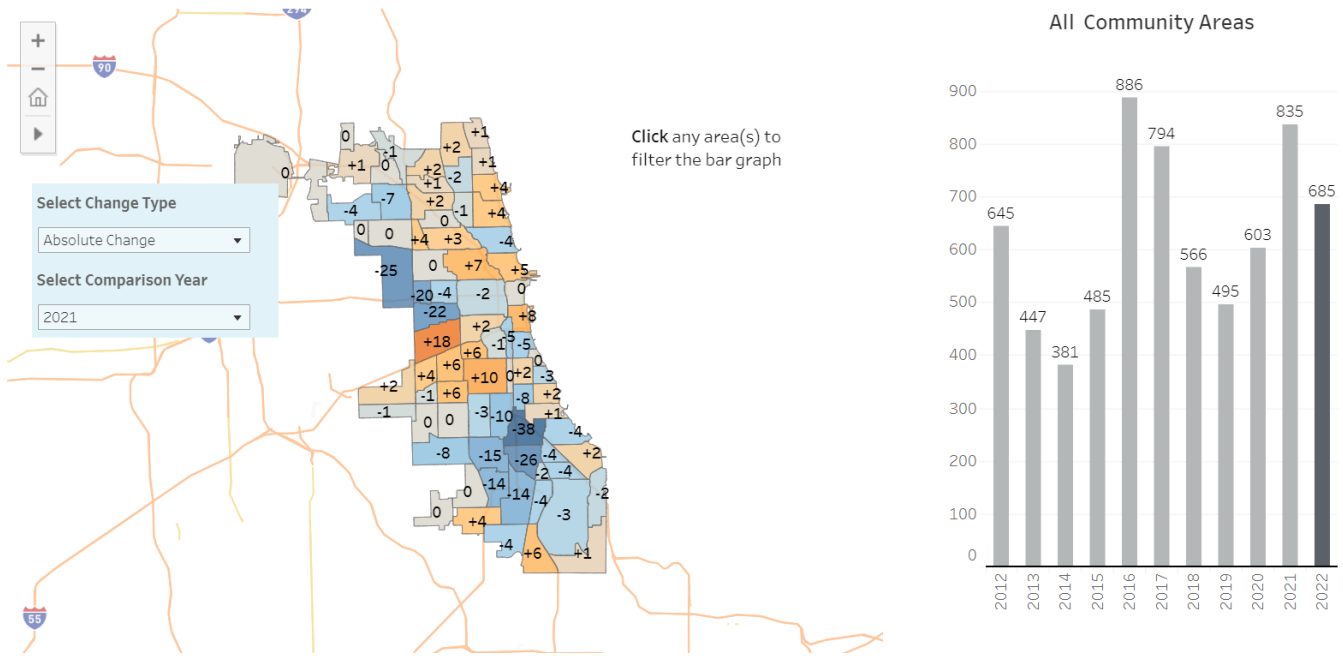

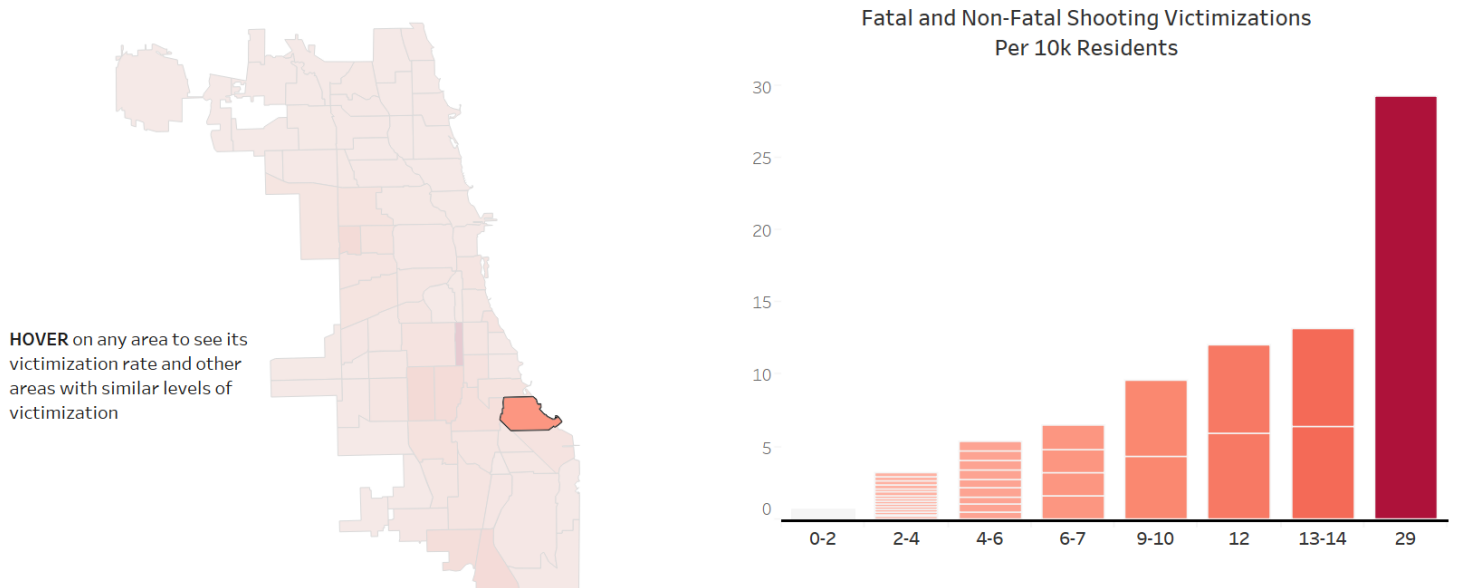
Fatal and Non-Fatal Shooting Victimization, Jan 1 through Apr 11

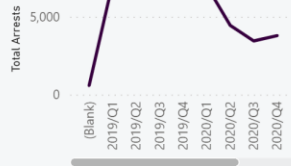

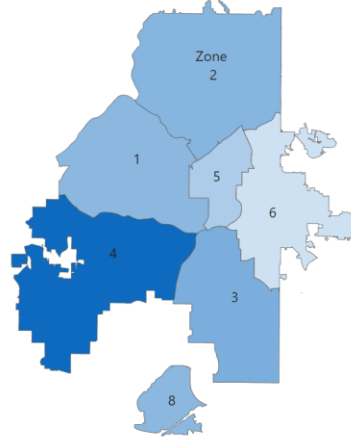

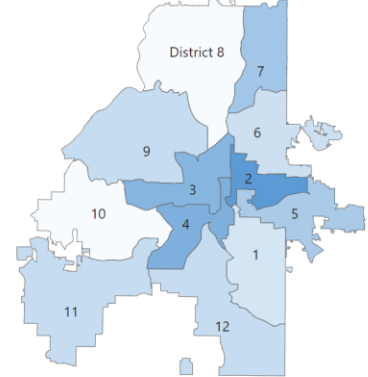

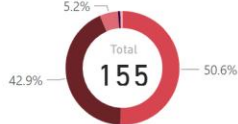

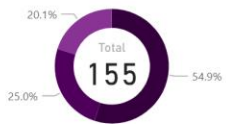

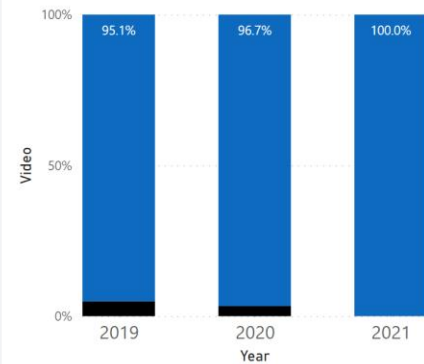

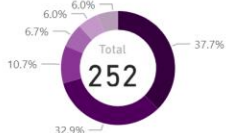

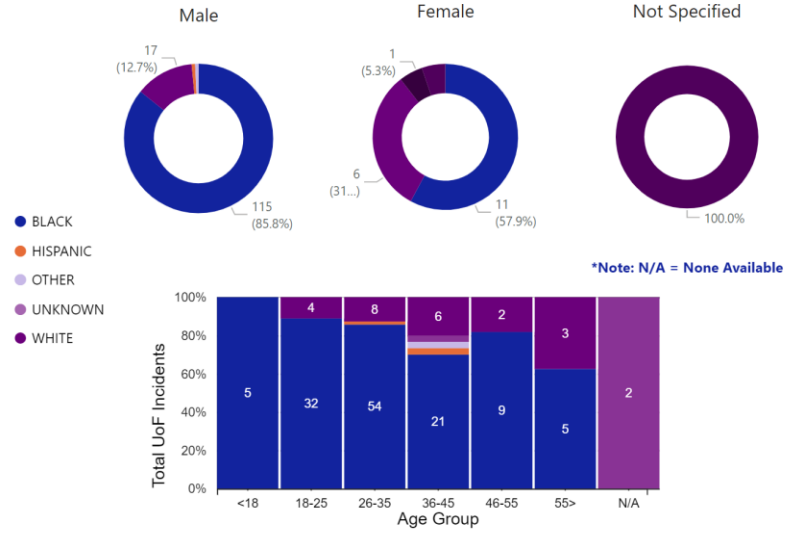

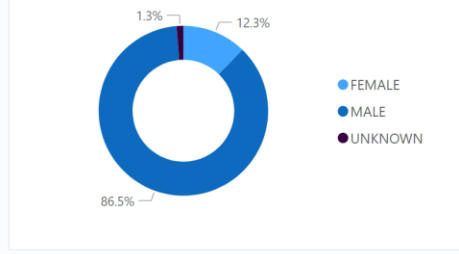

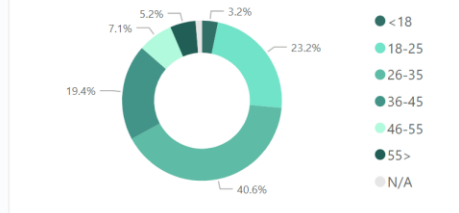
Subject Demographics by Gender and Race

Incidents by Subject Age

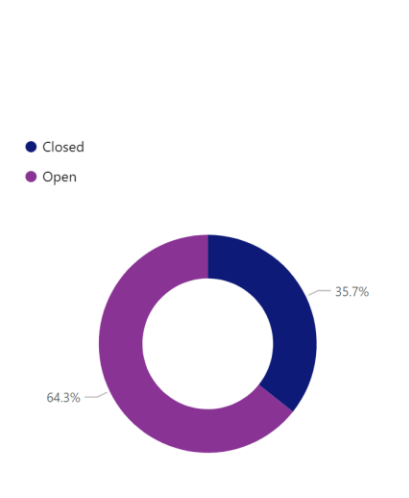

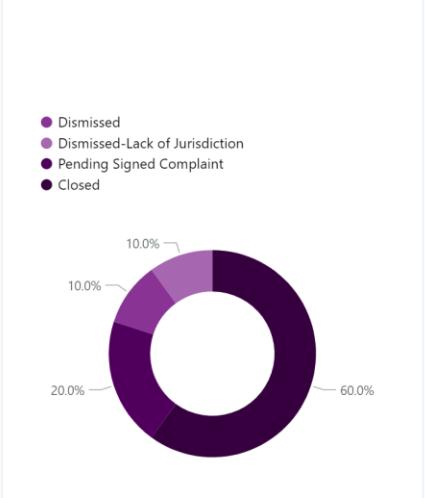

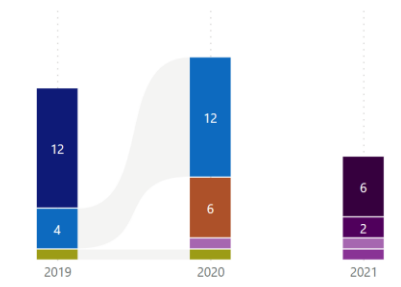
