1. Welcoming Remarks & Introductions -- Mayor Scott
2. CJCC Dashboard Review-- Ariel Liddell
 - Pretrial-The focus for the workgroup does need to be reevaluated so that it is more aligned with the priorities of the principal agencies. Home monitoring is a mayoral priority. Need to look into legislation around notifications. Discuss with DJS, MOGR, SAO. Request to troubleshoot the length of stay.
 - BPD-concerns about sentencing parole and probation. Question raised- do we expand the pretrial workgroup's focus to include these topics?
 - The need for judicial support for several of the workgroups was discussed. MONSE and the Mayor's team will strategize the best way to get judges to the table.
3. CJCC Workgroups
 - Assign Agencies and Identify Chairs
 - Community Justice-MONSE recommends DJS chair. Alycia Capozello of OPD has volunteered to co-chair
 - DV-MONSE recommends Councilwoman McCray and Lisa Nitsch remain co-chairs.
 - Fines, Fees, & Restitution- No chair identified. Recommendation that this group have judicial involvement. MONSE will follow up on this.
 - Interagency Data & IT (Formerly Public Safety Accountability Dashboard)-prior to the meeting SAO confirmed Darren O'Brien will continue to chair
 - Pretrial-Prior to the meeting DSPCS confirmed Commissioner Lennard K. Johnson as chair
